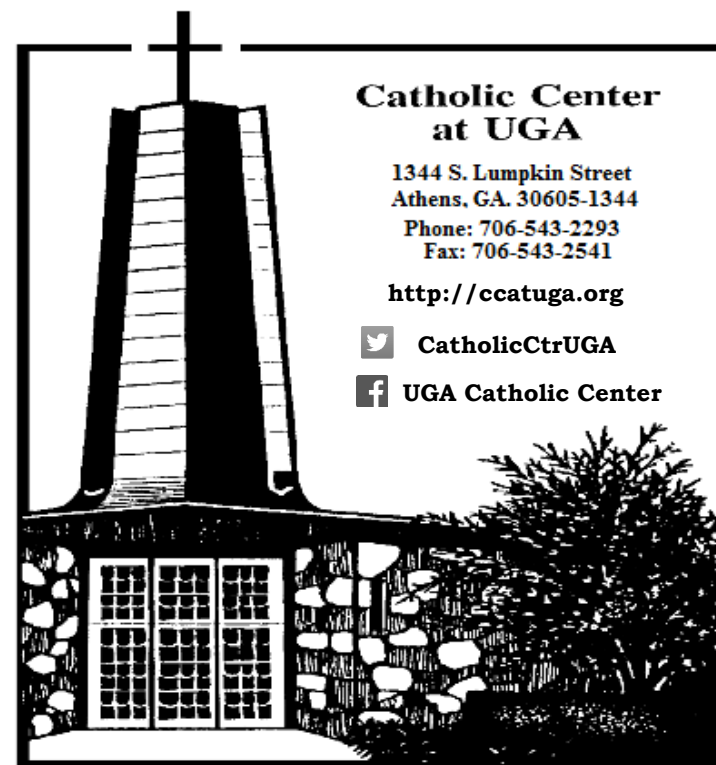
Franciscan Vocations

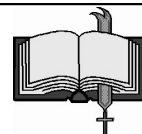

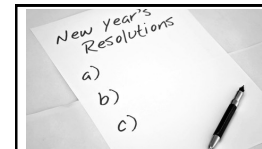
