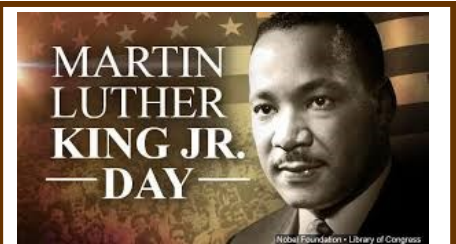

ALTERNATIVE SPRING BREAKS

One important aspect of our outreach to the students of UGA focuses on our alternative spring breaks. I have asked students to reflect and share on the importance of these encounters for them and their faith journey. Fr. Frank

"During my week at Pine Ridge, my group worked on two projects: building a community garden and carefully demolishing an old housing unit. I spent the week alongside a native man named Waylon and his family, working together to carefully remove pieces of an abandoned, rundown building from salvaged materials that would eventually be part of their new home. Waylon and his family, among other Native Americans we met, shared so much of their lives with my group. Waylon and his family told many stories of tragedy and loss, but also triumphs and joy. I feel so privileged to have spent a week working towards something so deeply needed by a family that I have grown to love. It was difficult to imagine that the abandoned building we were deconstructing would soon be part of Waylon's new home. I along with other members of the group, were so stricken by this harsh reality, we decided to start a club at UGA to fundraise for the non-profit that hosted our trip to Pine Ridge. We want to continue to support projects benefiting people like Waylon, and hope to get more students at UGA involved." – Lauren Wilson (Pine Ridge, South Dakota 2017)

"One of my fondest memories from my trip to Cuba was getting to know the wonderful friars we stayed with in Havana. Most of them could not speak any English, and most of us on the trip could not speak much Spanish. However, after spending a week together, we built some amazing, heartfelt friendships. In fact, we still message with the friars even today. On one of our last nights together, we all went out for ice cream in the city. Two of the friars brought along their guitars, and before we knew it, we were singing and dancing in a grassy area in the middle of the streets in Havana. The friars taught us some of their favorite Spanish songs and dances, and we, in turn, taught them some of ours. It was a night full of faith, love, and laughter, and yet we could barely speak 10 words in the same language." – Kimberly Stier (Cuba 2017)

Save Saturday March 3rd for our 40th Annual 5K Human Race. Proceeds go to support our Student Alternative Spring Break trips. More details to come...

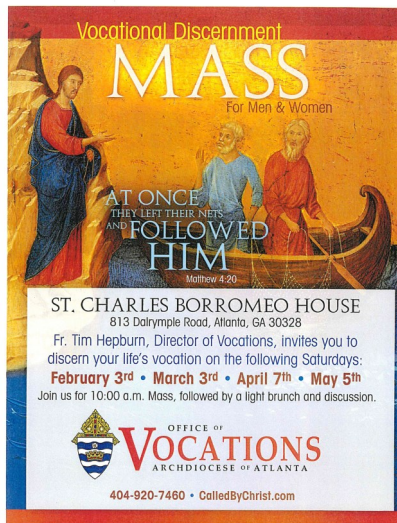
